


Landscape Architecture in Warsaw

It struck me how green and well maintained the public spaces of Warsaw seemed to be, with many amazing parks, both big and small, for me to explore and review.





Kabacki Forest Project






point of pressing, to the current position of the mouse




Releasing the mouse, will call the function of placing the area on superimposed on elements on which it cannot be superimposed (such as sidewalk).

area type elements:



- flowerbeds
